

## Beaches/Parks -- Food -- Farm Markets -- Galleries -- Misc.

<p><b>Cathead Bay Beach</b> This part of Leelanau State Park requires a 15-20 minute hike from the State Park trailhead to the beach. Sweeping views of sand dunes, Lake Michigan; walk a mile of uninhabited beach. Hike back to the "Overlook" for a photo opportunity of Lake Michigan &amp; the Fox Islands.</p>
<p><b>Black Sheep Crossing Farm Animal Sanctuary.</b> A no-kill nonprofit 501C3 organization for unwanted, abused, ill, injured and/or abandoned animals. Educational tours by appointment; not a petting zoo. 231-386-7234</p>
<p><b>Christmas Cove Beach</b> North of Peterson Park, this site offers a panoramic view of Lake Michigan, with picnic area and restrooms.</p>
<p><b>Peterson Park</b> Looks southwest to northwest, from a bluff 150 ft above Lake Michigan. Spectacular views of North and South Fox Islands, Beaver Island, North &amp; South Manitou Islands &amp; their Lighthouse. Stairway to the beach below, with playground, volleyball, rest rooms and picnic areas.</p>
<p><b>Gill's Pier Beach</b> Beautiful crescent of land that sweeps ¼ mile into Lake Michigan. View the Fox and Manitou Islands and Pyramid Point. There's a bench at the end of the spit for sunset viewing. Walk the sand beach to the north or south. Not a swimming beach due to the rocks.</p>
<p><b>Fischer's Happy Hour Tavern</b> A neighborhood favorite since 1971, in an old tavern atmosphere. Fare ranging from burgers and sandwiches to full entrees; homemade soups and desserts.</p>
<p><b>Shady Trails Camp</b> 6880 N. Shady Trails. Summer day camp for 5-14 year old youth, in July. 231-386-9880</p>

<p><b>Omena Beach</b> Small roadside swimming beach in Omena. Shallow water, playground and picnic facilities.</p>
<p><b>Leelanau State Park &amp; Grand Traverse Lighthouse</b> On the tip of the "Little Finger"; over 1,500 acres. The park has the Grand Traverse Lighthouse &amp; Museum, rustic campground, mini cabins, 8.5 miles of hiking/skiing trails and picnic areas. Petoskey stones can be found.</p>
<p><b>Braman Hill &amp; Northport Trails</b> Spectacular views of Northport Bay and surrounding countryside from the hilltop. Trails run from Johnson Rd to Garthe Pond, in Northport. Tennis/ basketball courts, skateboard park, ice skating &amp; sledding in winter.</p>
<p><b>Northport Pottery</b> Wide variety of pottery including raku, tiles and sculpture, by local artists Tom Gennette and George Cooper.</p>
<p><b>Knot Just a Bar</b> Full service restaurant/bar, overlooking Omena Bay. Fare ranges from burgers and sandwiches to full entrees.</p>
<p><b>Tamarack Gallery</b> Featuring folk art, outsider art, fine art and crafts for over 40 years. Original paintings, glass, ceramics, jewelry, sculpture &amp; furniture by over 65 nationally and regionally recognized artists.</p>
<p><b>Houdek Dunes Hiking Trails</b> Part of Leelanau Conservancy</p>
<p><b>Saving Birds Thru Habitat</b> Sanctuary to protect/enhance/restore habitat for birds; 5020 N. Putnam Road, Omena 231-271-3738 - call lst!</p>

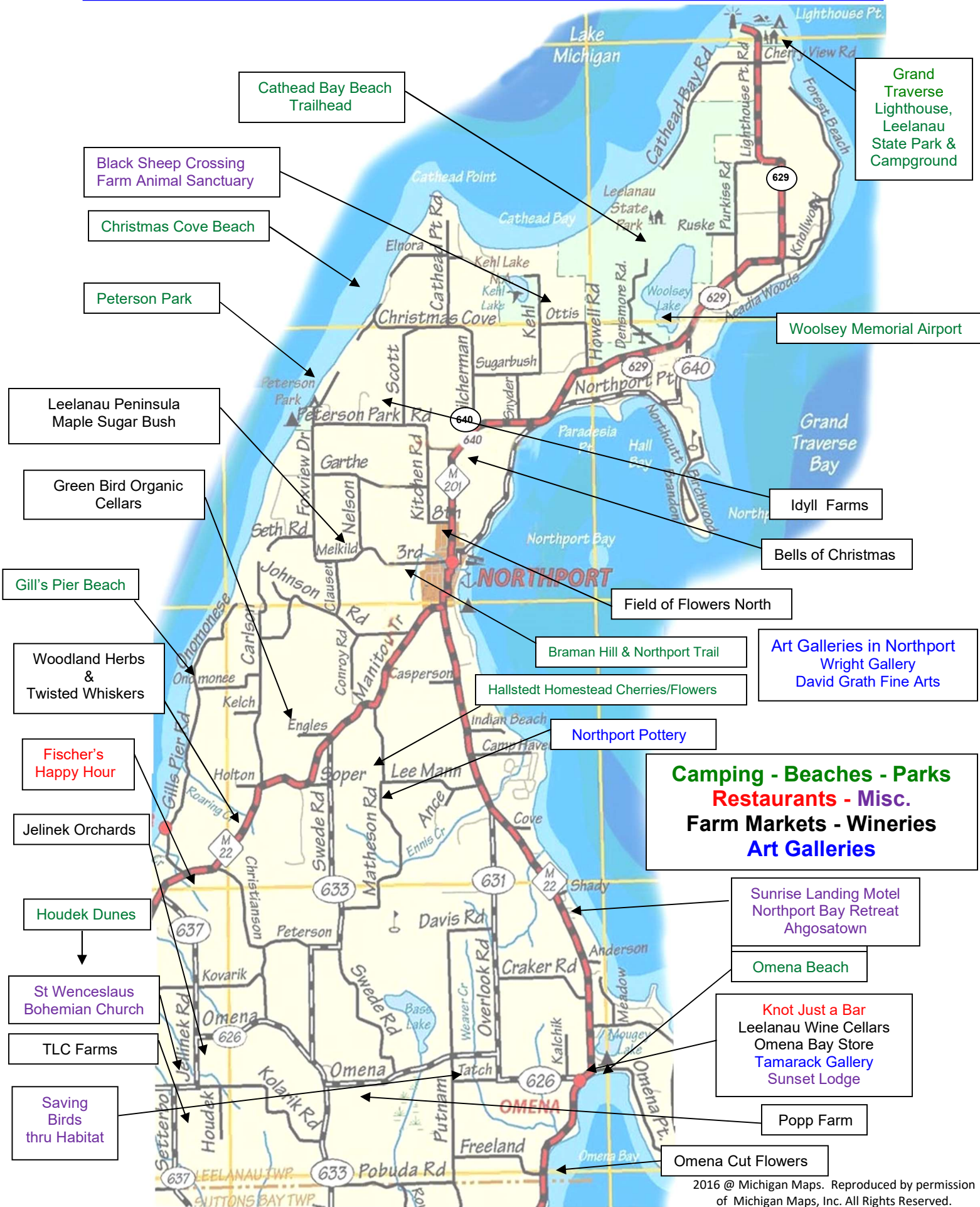
