NORTHPORT VILLAGE

Northport is a picturesque waterfront community with a proud heritage dating back to 1849. Located in northeastern Leelanau County on the shore of Grand Traverse Bay, the Village of Northport has a rich history and wealth of scenic beauty, small town character and recreational opportunities. Northport Village has over two miles of water frontage, an outstanding marina, well maintained parks & it's beautiful setting amidst beaches, rolling hills & orchards.

Northport received "Tree City USA" designation. A stormwater runoff project was completed on Nagonaba Street. Streetscape additions, a rain garden, a solar powered golf course and dark sky lighting have been implemented. A new partnership (with the Village, The Watershed Center Grand Traverse Bay & a grant from the EPA) is creating an extensive hardscaping project to divert water runoff pollution @ Main Street & Waukazoo Street.

OMENA VILLAGE

The unincorporated village of Omena, filled with mid-19th century charm, was designated a Historic District & listed on the National Register of Historic Places by the U.S. Department of Interior in 2017.

Nestled on the shore of beautiful & tranquil Omena Bay, located on the Leelanau Peninsula, along scenic M-22, Omena is a special place.

Woolsey Memorial Airport & State Historic Site

13591 E. Woolsey Lake Road
(On the road to Grand Traverse Lighthouse)
The historical state marker explains Byron Woolsey donated 80 acres of his dairy farm for this memorial airport honoring his son, Captain Clinton F. Woolsey. Woolsey’s plane crashed in 1927 when he was serving as one of ten pilots flying in the Pan American Goodwill Flight. Woolsey’s funeral & burial were here in Northport.

Grand Traverse Lighthouse Museum

This lighthouse is located inside Leelanau State Park and **a recreation passport or park entrance fee is required.** A **lighthouse admission fee** allows you entrance to the restored Lighthouse Keeper’s dwelling from the 1920’s & 1930’s. Climb the tower for a view of Lake Michigan, while hearing about museum artifacts via a self-guide tour. The Fog building has a remote operated vehicle in the pool. This ROV is used to locate & document area shipwrecks.
